Application Procedure

General Enrollment:

A qualified applicant is described as a person who meets the following general requirements:

- At least 17 years of age
- Complete and submit a Faith Christian College application with the following items:
 - 1) Full payment of registration fee
 - 2) Proof of graduation in the form of one of the following:
 - a) High School diploma
 - b) General Equivalent Diploma (GED)
 - c) Official and sealed high school or higher education institution transcript
 - Once the higher education transcript is received, an assessment will be conducted, and the granted credits will be transferred toward your degree
- Attend mandatory student orientation

Early Enrollment Students (still attending high school or pursuing GED):

- Must be at least 16 years of age
- Must attend an interview with the college administration, with a parent or legal guardian present if under the age of 18
- Complete all General Enrollment requirements except proof of graduation
- The student will receive their earned college diploma after college administration receives a copy of the student's high school diploma or GED

Statement of Non-Discrimination

Faith Christian College is an educational Christian institution that admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students of the organization. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admission policies, and other organization-administered programs.

Financial Information

In an attempt to make college available to all, we have made every effort to keep our costs accessible. It is our desire that students graduate with their education paid in full. To accomplish this goal, we require that students pay their tuition for each course in full before the course begins. As an encouragement to follow this requirement, students who pay on time receive a 10% tuition deduction for every course paid on time.

Payments can be made by cash, check, money order, or debit or credit card. A 3% processing fee will be charged to the student at the time of payment for paying with a debit or credit card; this is to cover the cost of fees charged to the college for processing such payments.

All textbooks required for courses at Faith Christian College are included in the cost of tuition and provided by the college for our in-person students. Students taking classes from a distance are responsible for purchasing their books.

Financial Information

Payment Plans

Tuition is due on the first night of each new course. If the student is not able to pay tuition in full at the beginning of the course, a payment plan must be arranged with the college bursar. The payment plan will be written up and signed by the student and the bursar, with the student receiving a copy and a second copy going in the student's file.

Financial Aid

Faith Christian College is not a Title IV accredited college, therefore Government Aid in the form of scholarships, grants, or loans is not available through the college. Students are welcome to privately seek out scholarships to help pay for their tuition.

There are a limited number of scholarships which have been funded through FCCollege. Students interested in applying for one of the scholarships must complete the Scholarship Application, which can be provided by the college or completed online in the Forms tab on the Populi dashboard. Completion of the application does not guarantee the student will be awarded a scholarship for tuition and/or fees.

Refund Policy

Students finding it necessary to withdraw from school will receive an adjustment in tuition paid. However, no fees will be refunded. The refunds for monthly tuition are as follows:

Before the first week of class: 100% Before the second week of class: 50%

No refunds after the second week of class

Any discounts received for pre-paying for a full semester or year will be void upon early withdrawal and refunds will be adjusted to account for the full tuition amount for attempted or completed courses.

Tax Information

Faith Christian College has not been independently approved by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to issue 1098-T forms. The costs for attending FCCollege are not generally eligible for a tax deduction. Additionally, payments made to FCCollege for tuition cannot be considered donations and therefore cannot be written off as such. If in doubt, please seek advice from a professional tax preparer.

Academic Requirements

Degree Granting Status

The Washington Student Achievement Council has determined that Faith Christian College qualifies for religious exempt status from the Degree-Granting Institutions Act for the following programs: Associate of Theology (ATh), Bachelor of Theology (BTh), Master of Theology (MTh), and Doctor of Theology (DTh). The Council makes no evaluation of the administration, faculty, business practices, financial condition or quality of the offerings by this institution. Any person desiring information about the requirements of the act or the applicability of those requirements to the institution may contact the Council at P.O. Accreditation Status

In an effort to focus specifically on theological studies, we have chosen not to pursue accreditation from a nationally recognized accrediting agency. Accrediting agencies recognized by the U.S. Department of Education require students to take core classes such as Mathematics, Science, and Humanities, which are not subjects that our specific curriculum focuses on in an effort to give our students a quality education while maintaining their regular work and life schedules. We do, however, strive to maintain the standards of quality that are required by accrediting agencies.

Transfer of Credits

FCCollege will accept transfer credits from other colleges for courses within the general boundaries of its programs. Transfer credits are accepted for undergraduate programs only and are at the discretion of FCCollege. The following guidelines will be followed when granting transfer credits:

- 1) Transfer credits will be granted only when the Registrar's Office receives an official transcript from the other school. Unofficial transcripts will not be accepted.
- 2) Credits may be transferred from other institutions on a course-by-course basis.
- 3) FCCollege will accept up to 50% of transfer credits toward a degree. 30 of the required 60 credits must be completed at FCCollege to receive an Associate Degree and 60 of the required 120 credits must be completed at FCCollege to receive a Bachelor's Degree.
- 4) FCCollege will accept credit for courses in which a student attained a "C-" or better grade.
- 5) FCCollege will only accept courses that are above a 100 level (courses designated ENG 90, MAT 95, etc. will not be transferred in).
- 6) FCCollege will not accept AP course credit (credits granted by high schools).

Academic Requirements

Transferability of Credits

Due to Faith Christian College not being accredited by a U.S. Department of Education recognized accrediting agency, transfer of credits from FCCollege is determined by the college to which the student is submitting transfer credits.

Life Experience in Ministry

Life Experience in Ministry (LEM) credit is only available for the undergraduate level. A qualified applicant for LEM is a minister who meets the following requirements:

- 1) The minister has experience teaching or preaching the Word of God in formal classes as higher education, church services for adults, youth or children for a minimum of four years.
- 2) Most of the material the minister has taught has been a result of their own studies and not pre-printed material.
- 3) Sunday school teaching, life group teaching or leadership, home Bible studies, cell groups or support groups **do not** count toward LEM credit.
- 4) Applicant is required to pay the LEM application fee and for each LEM credit awarded by FCCollege, as referenced in the Financial Information section on page 6 of this catalog.

Academic Policies

Classification of Students

Freshman – A student who has completed less than 30 credits

Sophomore – A student who has completed between 30 and 60 credits

Junior – A student who has completed between 60 and 90 credits

Senior – A student who has completed between 90 and 120 credits

Graduate Student – A student who has received a Bachelor's Degree from FCCollege and is pursuing a Master's Degree or Doctorate

Audit Student – A student who is attending classes for knowledge only, not pursuing credits or a degree

Full-time Student – A student who is registered for 30 credits during the school year

Part-time Student – A student who is registered for less than 30 credits during the school year

Academic Policies

Course Information

Each course consists of four weekly classes.

Vancouver Campus: Weekly classes are held on Tuesday, from 7:00pm to 9:45pm at Reign Church Vancouver.

Kelso Campus: Weekly classes are held on Tuesday, from 7:00pm to 9:45pm at Reign Church Kelso.

Morton Campus: Weekly classes are held on Wednesday, from 6:00pm to 8:45pm at Morton Jr. Sr. High School

Helena Campus: Weekly classes are held on Tuesday, from 6:00pm to 8:45pm at The Well Church.

Class Attendance

Class attendance is emphasized because studies have shown that learning and retention is greatly increased when a student is actively involved in their education. If a student is going to be absent from class, he or she must contact the school before class starts to report his or her absence. Classes are recorded and uploaded to the student website for students who miss classes. Students can earn extra credit by either attending class and participating or listening to the missed class and submitting make-up participation before the next class.

Grading

Tests taken on time will be graded within one week of their due date. Papers will also be attempted to be returned to the student in this time-frame, but may take longer depending on the number of students and length of paper.

Late Assignments

If the student misses class on the night an assignment is due, he or she will have one extra week to submit the assignment.

Late assignments will have a grade reduction as follows:

1 week late assignment grade drops 10% assignment grade will be 0%

Academic Policies

Academic Ethics

Academic dishonesty is taken seriously at FCCollege and the consequences may range from a failing grade for the assignment or exam to a loss of course credit. Plagiarism is claiming the work of others as your own without specific acknowledgement. Using the MLA Citation Style on papers avoids this issue. A student should assume that the final form of required work being turned in is meant to represent their own efforts and written in their own words. The use of A.I. or ChatGPT programs to complete written assignments will not be tolerated and will be treated as plagiarism.

Withdrawal Procedures

A withdrawal request must be submitted to the college in writing. The date of the withdrawal is the date that the signed request is received in the FCCollege office. When the withdrawal is processed, the student will be given a final grade of W (withdrawal) and any tuition refunds will be processed. A student who fails to notify the college of an intent to withdraw will not receive any tuition refunds for registered courses.

Graduation Requirements

To qualify for graduation, the student must meet credit and course requirements for their specified degree program (see Program Degree Requirements). Students must have no outstanding financial obligations to FCCollege to graduate. Students are required to submit a "Request to Graduate Form" by April 15 the year they intend to graduate.

Graduating with Honors

Full-time students that earn a grade point average of 3.50 or above attain superior academic standing.

Program Degree Requirements

AUDIT

This program is suited for the student who desires to increase his or her knowledge of the Bible, but does not want to pursue a degree in Theology. A student who is registered in the Audit program attends classes and contributes to class participation, but is not required to complete assignments or the Strategic Service Practicum. Audit students who complete 9 courses during the school year will receive a Certificate of Completion for the courses they completed during the year. Any courses that are completed as an Audit course will not count for credit if the student chooses to pursue a degree in Theology. The student may re-take the course for credit toward his or her degree.

ASSOCIATE OF THEOLOGY (ATh)

This program is suited for the student wanting more training in his or her knowledge of the Bible to help with their servanthood in the local church. This program includes the foundational courses for studying Theology.

Requirements for this program are as follows:

- Two year program
- Complete 60 credits
- Courses are scheduled depending on the student's chosen Track of Study
- Must complete Strategic Service Practicum each semester

Program Degree Requirements

BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY (BTh)

This program is suited for the student wanting to increase his or her church involvement to a leadership role. This program provides a broad selection of topics for further Theological education.

Requirements for this program are as follows:

- Four year program
- Complete 120 credits
- Courses are scheduled depending on the student's chosen Track of Study
- Must complete Strategic Service Practicum each semester

MASTER OF THEOLOGY (MTh)

This program is suited for the student interested in pastoring or teaching and a deeper knowledge in Theology, including a specific topic chosen by the student for an in-depth research thesis.

Requirements for this program are as follows:

- 1 ½ year program
- Must complete the Faith Christian College Bachelor of Theology program before entering the Master of Theology program
- Complete 36 credits
- Graduate level courses are denoted with a 5000 level course number (ex. TH5401)
- Graduate level courses involve increased coursework requirements beyond the Undergraduate requirements for the course
- Must complete Strategic Service Practicum each semester (SSP5501, SSP5502)
- After the student completes the in-class courses, he or she will register for the Masters Thesis course (6 credits) to research and write his or her Masters Thesis

Program Degree Requirements

DOCTOR OF THEOLOGY (DTh)

This program is suited for the student who wants to develop college curriculum and instruct others on the newly developed curriculum. This program is geared toward the student who can work independently and on a timeline to research theological topics and present them to others in an educational and engaging manner.

Requirements for this program are as follows:

- 3 year program
- Must complete the Faith Christian College Bachelor of Theology and Master of Theology programs before entering the Doctor of Theology program
- Complete 75 credits
- Graduate level courses are denoted with a 5000 level course number (ex. TH5501)
- Graduate level courses involve increased coursework requirements beyond the Undergraduate requirements for the course
- Must complete Strategic Service Practicum each semester for the first 2 years of the program (SSP5503-5506)

Program Yearly Outline:

Year 1

- Complete a total of 27 credits by taking Graduate level courses, writing curriculum for new courses, or teaching courses
- Complete 3 credits by completing the Strategic Service Practicum courses both semesters

Year 2

- Complete a total of 27 credits by taking Graduate level courses, writing curriculum for new courses, or teaching courses
- Complete 3 credits by completing the Strategic Service Practicum courses both semesters

Year 3

- Complete an individual plan, worth 15 credits, that is a collaborative plan between the student and college and approved by the college
- This plan can be creating an emphasis of study and writing and teaching the curriculum, writing and teaching curriculum for an existing emphasis of study, or a research project

Undergraduate Tracks of Study

BIBLICAL STUDIES

This Track of Study is for the student wanting a well-rounded knowledge of the Bible. Courses are a combination of learning who you are in Christ, knowledge about the Bible, and how to be a good steward and leader.

To earn an Associate of Theology, the student will complete 60 credits. To earn a Bachelor of Theology, the student will complete 120 credits.

General Courses

The courses in this Track are not taught every year and students may join in whichever Track is being taught that year. The other years of the student's education will have them follow the course tracks listed in Biblical Studies, beginning with Year 1.

During the Spring Semester, a group of students will go on a mission trip for approximately 7-10 days. This trip is organized by the college and can be located within the United States or internationally. Students will go beyond their classroom learning and actively use what they have been learning about the Word of God. Students will engage with local believers and non -believers and experience different cultures while spreading the Word to *all the nations*.

This opportunity is available to students who have completed at least two years at Faith Christian College and is limited to a small number of students each year.

The mission trip will replace the course the students would normally take during the month they go on their mission and will be worth 3 college credits.

The cost of going on the mission trip will vary depending on the location and will be paid for by the student.

Students interested in applying to participate in this year's mission trip can pick up an application from the college. If you have questions regarding the location, cost, timeframe, or nature of the mission trips, please do not hesitate to ask the college for more information!

*Please note mission trips are only offered through the Vancouver campus of Faith Christian College at this time. The administration of other campuses will decide when they are ready to begin offering mission trips through their campus. If you are interested in participating with a Vancouver mission trip before your campus begins offering trips of their own, please communicate with your administrator regarding information.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by CBL5***

CBL101/CBL5101 The 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership I

Everything rises and falls on leadership. This is course one of two courses that will give the student principles for being a successful leader. These principles will help the student become a leader that people want to follow.

3 credits

CBL104/CBL5104 The Emotionally Healthy Leader

This course will help the student discover how a deeper relationship with Jesus will help them deal with stress, planning, decision making, and other aspects of being a leader.

3 credits

CBL102/CBL5102 The 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership II

Everything rises and falls on leadership. This is course two of two courses that will give the student principles for being a successful leader. These principles will help the student become a leader that people want to follow.

3 credits

CBL105/CBL5105 The 25 Biblical Laws of Success I

This is course one of two on Biblical laws of success. This course will help the student learn key principles that are important to the pursuit of a successful career and life. The student will develop a mindset that encourages personal development.

3 credits

CBL103/CBL5103 Biblical Leadership

Jesus Christ is the ultimate example of leadership. This course will explore different leadership principles taught by Jesus throughout His ministry and how He built up the leaders around Him to carry on His ministry.

3 credits

CBL106/CBL5106 The 25 Biblical Laws of Success II

This is course two of two on Biblical laws of success. This course will help the student learn key principles that are important to the pursuit of a successful career and life. The student will develop a mindset that encourages personal development.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by CBL5***

CBL107/CBL5107 Biblical Economics

This course will help the student learn what the Bible says about business and finance. It will cover subjects such as false ideas about money, the purpose of money, God's economy, sowing and reaping, and wealth and success.

3 credits

CBL201/CBL5201 Foundation of Leadership

This course will introduce students to a biblical concept of leadership and dive into a significant concept that Jesus demonstrated in His life and ministry. Students will learn their role in this leadership model and find out their source of authority. This class will also teach on growing into your leadership role and what that will take as well as the importance of focus.

3 credits

CBL108/CBL5108 Leaders in History

This course will focus on leaders in history that were examples of strong leadership. The student will research and present a leader that demonstrates the qualities of a good leader.

3 credits

CBL202/CBL5202 Leadership: the Good, the Bad, and the Ugly

This course will teach students some of the commonsense concepts involved in leadership and highlight what makes a good leader versus a bad leader and the unique classification of an ugly leader. This class will also explore the different leadership styles and the strengths and weaknesses of each.

3 credits

CBL109/CBL5109 Developing Your Dream

This course is an in-depth study of achieving one's dreams by reviewing and answering 10 powerful, thought-provoking and honest questions. Addressing these 10 questions provides a good framework in assisting those who want to see their dreams become reality.

3 credits

CBL203/CBL5203 Leadership in Ministry & Business

This course will highlight the differences and similarities between leadership in ministry and business. Not all concepts that work in one area will automatically work in the other, but many of the same concepts will work in both.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by CBL5***

CBL204/CBL5204 Biblical Finance I

This course will take a detailed look at how Christianity and economics work together. Among other topics, the importance of Christians being prosperous to help further the Kingdom of God will be discussed.

3 credits

CBL207/CBL5207 Biblical Finance II

This course will continue the teaching from CBL204, Biblical Finance I, and take a detailed look at how Christianity and economics work together. Among other topics, the importance of Christians being prosperous to help further the Kingdom of God will be discussed.

3 credits

CBL205/CBL5205 Dedication in Leadership

This course will focus on the importance of leaders being dedicated to the process of becoming the very best they can be as well as not being influenced by other people's accomplishments. Students will also discover there is a standard of leadership that requires commitment.

3 credits

CBL208/CBL5208 Leadership Is Full of Surprises I

This course will explore several topics of leadership that will reveal details that the students will find helpful in their journey to becoming an excellent leader.

3 credits

CBL206/CBL5206 Leadership is Influence

This course will cover the concept of the importance of influence on leadership. Students will learn about character, attitude, teamwork, wisdom, conduct, vision, and communication. All of these are important topics in influencing leadership.

3 credits

CBL209/CBL5209 Leadership is Full of Surprises II

This course will continue to explore several topics of leadership that will reveal details that the students will find helpful in their journey to becoming an excellent leader. Opportunities to discuss these leadership topics with current business owners will be provided.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by CBL5***
Mission Trip courses qualify for Undergraduate and Graduate programs of study.

MT100 Mission Trip, Year 1

Students will go beyond their classroom learning and actively use what they have been learning about the Word of God. Students will engage with local believers and non-believers and experience different cultures while spreading the Word to all the nations. This course is for students going on their first mission trip with the college. This course qualifies for both Undergraduate and Graduate programs.

3 credits

MT200 Mission Trip, Year 2

Students will go beyond their classroom learning and actively use what they have been learning about the Word of God. Students will engage with local believers and non-believers and experience different cultures while spreading the Word to all the nations. This course is for students going on their second mission trip with the college. This course qualifies for both Undergraduate and Graduate programs.

3 credits

MT300 Mission Trip, Year 3

Students will go beyond their classroom learning and actively use what they have been learning about the Word of God. Students will engage with local believers and non-believers and experience different cultures while spreading the Word to all the nations. This course is for students going on their third mission trip with the college. This course qualifies for both Undergraduate and Graduate programs.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH101 God's Righteousness

Students will learn about the human being's spirit, soul, and body as well as how Jesus has provided legal justification and right standing with our Creator.

3 credits

TH104 Believer's Authority

Students will examine the authority of the believer, what it is, and how to apply it. They will also review the relationship between having authority and being under authority. The practical result is to walk in that authority daily.

3 credits

TH102 New Testament Survey

This course offers an overview of the books of the New Testament. Students will learn the author, to whom it was addressed, and the general theme of each book.

3 credits

TH105 Healing I

This is course one of two courses on healing. Students will learn what the Word of God says about healing, how to pray to receive their healing, and what may hinder them from receiving it.

3 credits

TH103 How to Study the Bible

Students will learn the importance of journaling, how to do topical studies, book studies, character studies, specific words of the Bible studies, and in-depth studies within the framework of a research paper.

3 credits

TH106 Who I Am in Christ

This course teaches who we are in Christ as new creatures and how to experience the power of walking daily in these truths; moreover, to understand the transformation work Jesus has performed in our lives.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH107 Stewardship

This course will guide the students to a full understanding of God's will relating to money and stewardship of resources within their spheres of influence. They will learn the law of sowing and reaping leading to further enjoyment of God's favor in their lives. Students will learn practical steps to live a balanced lifestyle.

3 credits

TH201/TH5201 The Four Gospels

This course will give students an overview of the four Gospels; the life of Jesus Christ while here on earth. It will also cover and discuss specific subjects the Lord taught His disciples and the people.

3 credits

TH108 The Epistles of John

Students will learn the importance of having a personal relationship with God; understand His love for us, and the importance to abide in the faith. These books clarify how Jesus was both God and Human at the same time.

3 credits

TH202/TH5202 Hearing the Voice of God

This course will help each student have deeper intimacy with the Lord and be able to recognize His voice.

3 credits

TH109 Live & Walk by Faith

This course builds a firm knowledge of faith's foundation in God's Word and increases faith through practical application.

3 credits

TH203/TH5203 Strategic Service

The ministry of helps is an appointed and anointed ministry of the Lord. It is how the Lord's plans are put into action. Understanding and working under authority is God's plan for the Church and our personal lives. This course addresses both concepts and their preferred interaction.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH204/TH5204 Communing with God

This course will help students communicate with God in a more personal way and learn about different types of prayer. Jesus reconciled our relationship with God the Father; therefore, we are able to be in the presence of Abba Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit.

3 credits

TH207/TH5207 Blood Covenant

Students will learn what a blood covenant is and what it means for us to be in blood covenant with God. This course will permanently, positively impact your view of salvation, communion, baptism and the passionate, personal relationship you have with our Creator.

3 credits

TH205/TH5205 Healing II

This is course two of two courses on healing. Students will learn what the Word of God says about healing, how to pray to receive their healing, and what may hinder them from receiving it.

3 credits

TH208/TH5208 Basic Bible Doctrine

This course covers: the inspired Scripture, one true God and the Trinity, the Deity of Jesus Christ, the fall and rescue of man, the present day ministry of the Holy Spirit, divine healing, Jesus Christ's return for His church, and heaven and hell.

3 credits

TH206/TH5206 The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Students will learn the principles and purpose of the New Testament spiritual gifts, how to use them in their daily lives, and how they operate within the church. It will stir a desire to understand the anointing working through the body of Christ and the value of flowing in it.

3 credits

TH209/TH5209 Old Testament Survey I

This is course one of two courses covering the Old Testament. It covers the first 17 books. These courses are an overview of the books of the Old Testament. Students will know each book's author, to whom it was addressed, and its general theme. They will see how Christ is portrayed in the Old Testament and perceive the value of studying the Old Testament.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH301/TH5301 The Book of Acts I

This is course one of two courses covering the book of Acts. This course will study the importance and dynamics of the Holy Spirit within the early church and draw positive correlations to current events in the Church. This course covers the first half of the book of Acts.

3 credits

TH304/TH5304 Survey of the Pauline Epistles

This course provides an overview of the other 10 epistles written by the Apostle Paul. It is a study of the audience, the purpose, and the effect of each epistle.

3 credits

TH302/TH5302 The Art of Communication

The student will learn the art of public speaking/communication. Students will also learn different styles of communication and how to write and perform different styles of sermons.

3 credits

TH305/TH5305 Attributes of the Believer

Students will learn how to follow the example of Jesus Christ and His character, drawing strength from the relationship with the Father.

3 credits

TH303/TH5303 Personal Destiny

Everyone has a personal destiny, not just those called to the Fivefold Ministry. This course will help students find out who God has called them to be.

3 credits

TH306/TH5306 The General Epistles

This course is an overview of the books of James, Peter, John, and Jude. Students will learn why the books were written and what it means to believers today.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH307/TH5307 New Age Cults & Religions

This course is designed to give the students a working knowledge of religions and cults. The students will be more equipped to discern the difference between sound doctrine and false doctrine.

3 credits

TH401/TH5401 The Book of Acts II

This is course two of two courses covering the book of Acts. This course will study the importance and dynamics of the Holy Spirit within the early church and draw positive correlations to current events in the Church. This course covers the second half of the book of Acts.

3 credits

TH308/TH5308 The Book of Galatians

This study of the book of Galatians encourages students to learn how Jesus bought freedom for every human being and replaced living under the Law with living under Grace.

3 credits

TH402/TH5402 The Book of Philippians

This course is an in-depth study of the Apostle Paul's letter to one of his favorite churches. This epistle is very unique and filled with nuggets for modern day life.

3 credits

TH309/TH5309 Your Thought Life

The student will learn how to overcome and overpower negative thoughts, lies, fear, condemnation, and discouragements through the Word of God. Our thought life on its own will create bigger problems. God has promises, when applied, that will help us to live above those deceptions.

3 credits

TH403/TH5403 Fruit of the Holy Spirit I

This is course one of two covering the fruit of the Holy Spirit. These courses discuss and explore the importance of a true understanding of the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH404/TH5404 Fruit of the Holy Spirit II

This is course two of two covering the fruit of the Holy Spirit. These courses discuss and explore the importance of a true understanding of the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit.

3 credits

TH407/TH5407 A Study of Angels

This course will study the biblical history of angels interacting with individuals in the Bible and explore the possibilities of angels' interaction in our own lives today.

3 credits

TH405/TH5405 Fulfilling Your Purpose

This course will help the student learn how to achieve his or her goals. God has given you a destiny, which we learned about in the Personal Destiny course. This course will give you practical steps to realizing your destiny.

3 credits

TH408/TH5408 The Book of Hebrews

The book of Hebrews demonstrates the authority and dominion Jesus has over the law, prophets, and angels, and encourages believers to stand strong in their faith.

3 credits

TH406/TH5406 The Pastoral Epistles

This course covers the letters to Timothy and Titus through the books of I & II Timothy and Titus. It examines scriptural qualifications for pastors and ministers and advice and encouragement for situations pastors face. It also shows that even though not everyone is called to the fivefold ministry, all believers are ministers of the Gospel of Christ

3 credits

TH409/TH5409 The Books of Ephesians and Colossians

This course unveils the mystery of the church; it reveals God's will to unite the Jew and the Gentile and to equip and empower Christians.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH501/TH5501 The Book of I Corinthians

The city of Corinth was a major commercial city full of diverse people. The wide range of backgrounds and moral beliefs made this a prime mission field for the Apostle Paul. Paul addresses man's sinful ways and the importance of sanctification so the Church would live differently than the world.

3 credits

TH504/TH5504 The Books of Ezra and Nehemiah

The books of Ezra and Nehemiah document the timeframe of Israel returning from the 70 year exile, rebuilding the temple, and rebuilding the wall around Jerusalem. These are the last books of the Old Testament chronologically before 400 years of silence, broken by the birth of John the Baptist.

3 credits

TH502/TH5502 The Book of II Corinthians

This is a follow-up letter from Paul to the church in Corinth, defending his authority and position with the church. He addresses criticism and challenges to his authority.

3 credits

TH505/TH5505 The Power of Imagination

Too often believers pray without ever receiving what they prayed for. This is because they do not know how to use their imagination the way God intended, seeing themselves having the results of their prayers. This course will unlock the power of your imagination and explain how you can put it to work as you strive to fulfill God's plan for your life.

3 credits

TH503/TH5503 The Books of I & II Thessalonians

This course covers the books of I & II Thessalonians. In these books of the New Testament students will see a different side of the Apostle Paul from many of his writings. The Thessalonian Church is doing very well in their new life in Christ and Paul writes to encourage them to excel even more by increasing their love for one another, and to rejoice, pray, and give thanks always.

3 credits

TH506/TH5506 The Book of Romans I

This is course one of two courses covering the book of Romans. This course provides an in-depth study of Paul's letters to the Christians in Rome. This is Paul's greatest theological declaration of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Courses with a Graduate level offering denoted by TH5***

TH507/TH5507 The Book of Romans II

This is course two of two courses covering the book of Romans. This course provides an in-depth study of Paul's letters to the Christians in Rome. This is Paul's greatest theological declaration of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

3 credits

TH5520 Masters Thesis

The student will prepare a comprehensive research on a theological subject. It is to be chosen by the student and approved by the administration of the school.

6 credits

TH508/TH5508 Old Testament Survey II

This is course two of two courses covering the Old Testament. It covers the last 22 books. These courses are an overview of the books of the Old Testament. Students will know each book's author, to whom it was addressed, and its general theme. They will see how Christ is portrayed in the Old Testament and perceive the value of studying the Old Testament.

3 credits

IS5100-5220 Independent Study

These courses are designated for the student who is in a Graduate level program and is either writing curriculum or teaching new courses to go toward their degree. These courses are an Independent Study style of courses and graded by the college administration.

3 credits

TH509/TH5509 Women Leaders of the Bible

There is a lot of debate regarding the role of women in the church today. This course will highlight the important roles women had from the Old Testament to the founding and building of the Christian church in the New Testament.

3 credits

DTH5300 Doctor of Theology Year 3

The student will complete an individual plan that is a collaborative plan between the student and college and approved by the college. This plan can be creating an emphasis of study and writing and teaching the curriculum, writing and teaching curriculum for an existing emphasis of study, or a research project.
